I have had a fair few enquiries regarding parking in and around my Ward and am trying to persuade Ayrshire Roads Alliance to have a look at small areas which could be converted to additional parking for residents.

I've also had many concerns regarding the increase in hall lets which affects many local groups, including After School Clubs. I would like to assure you that we as a Group are challenging these increases.

Something to look forward to will be the new Queen Margaret Academy which is taking shape and promises to be a superb building for the pupils. I had the pleasure of attending the Sod Cutting by John Swinney, MSP, The Deputy First Minister and Cabinet Secretary for Education and Skills. We are all looking forward to the opening of this wonderful new facility.
