Notes

- This report provides comparison crime figures for the month of February in 2018 and 2017, but due to the date of the meeting this is only inclusive of 1st – 26th February in both years.
- The levels of reported crimes remains low and is positive overall. Assaults have increased slightly whilst drugs offences have reduced and Breaches of the Peace have remained static but the detection rate remains high with regard to these crime types.
- 3. There was 1 reported Housebreaking in January, which remained static and no car crime reported in the Ayr East ward this month, the same as last year, residents should remain vigilant regarding leaving items visible in their cars and ensuring their homes and outbuildings are locked and secured correctly. The detections rates for these crimes remain quite low and anyone seen acting suspiciously should be reported to police immediately.
- No drink or disqualified driving offences were detected in your ward area but our officers will continue high visibility patrols to deter road traffic crimes.
