The categories are:

Building relationships

This award is for an individual or team who has exemplified partnership working to deliver services more efficiently or effectively. The nominee may have worked across boundaries within NHS Ayrshire & Arran, the health and social care partnerships or with external partners.

Caring for people

This award is for an individual or team who can demonstrate that they have provided or developed an exceptional service which has made a significant improvement to the quality of care for one or more patients, people using NHS Ayrshire & Arran services or carers.

Caring for our staff

This award is for an individual or team who can demonstrate that they have provided or developed an exceptional service which has made a significant improvement to the health, safety and wellbeing of our staff.

Light bulb moments - creativity and innovation

This award is for an individual or team who may have introduced a one-off bright idea (or even a series of bright ideas) which has led to greater efficiency and improved services for patients, people who use our services, carers, partner organisations, departments or colleagues within NHS Ayrshire & Arran or the health and social care partnerships. They may have led the field in exploring and developing new methods or sharing best practice.

Behind the scenes

This award is for an individual who, in the course of doing their job, makes a real difference to people in Ayrshire and Arran, but whose work often goes unrecognised. This individual may be out of the limelight, but provides invaluable support to frontline services or colleagues in other teams, often going the 'extra mile' for the sake of others.

Leading by example

This award is for an individual who has demonstrated excellent leadership skills by showing genuine concern for others, mentoring or supporting and enabling the development or people and services, and inspiring and motivating others to be the best they can be.

Rising star

This award is for a young person who, in the course of his or her studies or work placement – for example, a junior doctor or student nurse - has shown impressive dedication and commitment to furthering themselves and supporting the work of NHS Ayrshire & Arran.

Volunteer of the year

This award is for an individual, group or charity that has worked in partnership with NHS Ayrshire & Arran, giving up their time (unpaid) to improve and bring benefits to people who use NHS services, their carers and staff.

Team of the year

This award is for a team within NHS Ayrshire & Arran who has consistently shown that they provide excellent, quality, effective and efficient services. These might be services provided for patients, service users, carers, the public, partner organisations or other departments or colleagues within NHS Ayrshire & Arran.

Entries must be submitted on an entry form, and be no more than 500 words. You may also include or attach examples of work and three pieces of supporting material or literature as evidence.
